Parachute Ideas

1. Paper napkin parachute with tied strings to slow the egg's fall.
2. Many little parachutes working together for a soft landing.
3. Umbrella-style parachute from plastic bags to catch air.
4. Layered coffee filters that fill with air as they drop.
5. Tissue paper flower parachute that opens on the way down.
6. Handkerchief parachute with each corner tied to the egg holder.
7. Small dome parachute with holes to slow the fall.
8. Square fabric parachute with strings tied to a straw frame.
9. Balloon-material parachute that puffs up fast.

Design Strategy Ideas

- 151. Egg hung in the center by rubber bands.
- 152. Straw lattice forming a cradle for the egg.
- 153. Tripod legs that bend and soak up shock.
- 154. Corner bumpers that hit first to protect the egg.
- 155. Bubble-wrap "helmet" on the egg only.
- 156. Rubber-band hammock inside the outer shell.
- 157. Egg covered in soft clay that squishes.
- 158. String web inside like a small hammock.

159. Air-bag pouch from plastic bag for cushion.
160. Bent-straw springs on bottom corners.
161. Spiral-wire springs from a notebook coil.
162. Pyramid shape with egg safely at the core.
163. Detachable pad that hits ground first.
164. Side "air bags" that expand if flipped.
165. Accordion paper folds under the egg.
166. Inner tube ring keeping egg in the middle.
167. Foam corners that take the first hit.
168. Spoon springs on bottom for soft landing.
169. Cardboard honeycomb around the egg.
170. Slinky coil at the base for bounce.
171. Balloon bumpers around container edges.
172. Parachute that doubles as cushion at end.
173. Soft candy legs that squish on impact.
174. Inner box hung by elastic bands.

208. Styrofoam, toothpicks, and fabric scrap design.

255. Spreaders that push impact force out to the edges.
256. Materials that soak up energy by squishing down.
257. Springy parts that bounce the landing instead of a crash.
258. Trapped air cushions under the container for soft hits.
259. Designs that change straight-down force to a side push.
