Ocean Habitat Project Ideas for Students

Ocean Habitat Project for 1st Grade

- 1. Make a bright fish bowl using paper and crayons.
- 2. Use blue jello and put gummy fish inside for fun.
- 3. Paint rocks to look like shells and ocean treasures.
- 4. Cut out paper fish and hang them on strings from the ceiling.
- 5. Fill a clear bottle with blue water and toy sea animals.
- 6. Draw ocean scenes with smiling dolphins and bright coral.
- 7. Make an octopus using your handprint with purple and pink paint.
- 8. Use old socks and googly eyes to make sea animal puppets.
- 9. Use colorful play dough and blocks to build a coral reef.
- 10. Make ocean waves in a jar with oil and water.
- 11. Draw sea animals on paper plates for an ocean dinner party.
- 12. Use cotton balls to make white clouds over the ocean.
- 13. Use real fish and safe paint to make fish prints.
- 14. Make a cave with brown paper bags and tape them together.
- 15. Use pipe cleaners and foam to make a seahorse family.
- 16. Make jellyfish with clear cups and colorful ribbons.
- 17. Draw a whale family swimming in blue ocean water.
- 18. Make a starfish with yellow paper and glitter to make it sparkle.
- 19. Put rice in containers and shake them to make ocean sounds.
- 20. Use red paper plates and orange pipe cleaners to make a crab.
- 21. Make a turtle shell with green paper and brown dots.

- 22. Make a fish mobile using a hanger and colorful string.
- 23. Cut out a shark fin from gray cardboard and draw on it.
- 24. Make sea anemone with tissue paper and green stems.
- 25. Make a treasure chest from a box and add shiny stickers.

Ocean Habitat Project for 2nd Grade

- 26. Make a box model with three ocean layers to show water depths.
- 27. Find five ocean animals and write one sentence about each.
- 28. Try a saltwater experiment to learn why ocean water is salty.
- 29. Make a poster of the ocean food chain with pictures and arrows.
- 30. Use old things from your kitchen to build a coral reef model.
- 31. Draw ocean animals on cards and write cool facts about them.
- 32. Make a wave machine using clear container and blue water.
- 33. Use baking soda and vinegar to make an underwater volcano.
- 34. Draw a poster to show clean ocean water and dirty water.
- 35. Use paper plates to make a spinning sea turtle life cycle.
- 36. Use green streamers from the ceiling to show a kelp forest.
- 37. Try mixing warm and cold water to learn about ocean temperatures.
- 38. Make a picture of a sea animal city where they live happily.
- 39. Build a model of a tide pool showing where animals live.
- 40. Draw ocean animals and write about their homes in a small book.
- 41. Make a map to show how whales travel across oceans.
- 42. Use clay and dark things to make a deep sea trench model.
- 43. Put floating objects in water to show how currents move.

- 44. Draw fish and write how they live and breathe in water.
- 45. Build a toy submarine that floats and doesn't sink.
- 46. Use blue paper to show different ocean layers from top to bottom.
- 47. Make a chart to group fish, mammals, and reptiles.
- 48. Show beach erosion by using water to move sand around.
- 49. Make a fun matching game with ocean animals and where they live.
- 50. Try a gill experiment to show how fish breathe underwater.

Ocean Habitat Project for 3rd Grade

- 51. Find and share what people are doing to protect the oceans.
- 52. Make a model that shows how ocean tides go up and down in a day.
- 53. Draw a food web that shows what ocean animals eat and who eats them.
- 54. Do an experiment to grow salt crystals like in the ocean.
- 55. Build a model to show how underwater quakes cause big waves.
- 56. Make a presentation to show how sea animals stay safe and live.
- 57. Do a fun experiment that shows how water pressure works deep down.
- 58. Build a floating island with cool plants and animals living on it.
- 59. Make a presentation with fun ways to clean up ocean plastic.
- 60. Try an experiment to see how acid water affects sea animals with shells.
- 61. Use warm and cold water to make a model of ocean currents.
- 62. Draw posters of ocean animals that need help and protection.
- 63. Use glow-in-the-dark paint to make sea animals light up in a dark room.
- 64. Make a timeline to show when people explored the ocean.
- 65. Create a project that shows how warmer weather changes the oceans.
- 66. Play a game to show which animals eat others in the sea.

- 67. Build a model of an underwater lab where people study sea animals.
- 68. Give a talk about how whales and dolphins talk to each other.
- 69. Make a small model that shows how waves and wind make power.
- 70. Try an experiment that shows how warm water makes coral lose color.
- 71. Draw a map showing where ocean mountains and deep places are.

- 80. Do ocean animal yoga and act like you're swimming.
- 81. Play ocean music and dance like fish and whales.
- 82. Make a mini aguarium with a clear box and toy fish.
- 83. Make fun ocean snacks with blue jello and gummy fish.
- 84. Write a storybook where your family are ocean animals.
- 85. Build a beach in a sandbox using shells and toys.
- 86. Make sea animal costumes using old clothes and crafts.
- 87. Play a treasure hunt game by hiding things around the house.
- 88. Make a small ocean jar with toys and tiny decorations.
- 89. Use your fingerprints to make pictures of sea animals.

- 90. Create a calm ocean space with soft lights and blue colors.
- 91. Build a periscope to look under water in your tub or pool.
- 92. Make a memory game with ocean pictures on cards.
- 93. Make a fun list of things to find on your next beach trip.
- 94. Make boats and see if they float in the tub or sink.

- 101. Paint an ocean sunset with dolphins and whales jumping.
- 102. Use tissue paper to make jellyfish with long ribbons.
- 103. Make a turtle art piece using eggshells and paint.
- 104. Build a coral reef with wire and fun craft stuff.
- 105. Make animal masks for ocean pretend play.
- 106. Take blue-toned photos with sea toys and make a display.
- 107. Build a moving ocean sculpture that blows in the wind.
- 108. Make finger puppets of sea animals for storytelling.
- 109. Make a collage of the ocean using magazine pictures.
- 110. Create a glowing ocean scene in a light-up box.

- 126. Test what sinks or floats in salt and fresh water.

- 130. Try to clean up pretend oil spills with different things.
- 131. Test ocean acid with paper and different water samples.
- 132. Show how pressure changes deep underwater using a simple test.
- 133. Measure how much water goes away over time in an open cup.
- 134. Make a toy that can breathe under water using air tricks.
- 135. Build a model that makes power using wave motion.

- 136. Stack water at different temps to see ocean layers.
- 137. Use a microscope to look at tiny plankton in water.
- 138. Clean dirty ocean water using simple filters you build.
- 139. Use glow stuff to make sea lights in a dark tub.
- 140. Test how fish float or sink in water by using toys.
- 141. Show how the moon and sun pull on ocean tides.
- 142. Try to hear how sound moves in water with a test.
- 143. Watch how salt crystals grow over a few days.
- 144. Play a game that shows how ocean life works together.
- 145. Test how much light gets into deeper water.
- 146. Use wind to make waves in a container of water.
- 147. Show how warm and cool water can make ocean power.
- 148. Make a project to show how food energy moves in ocean life.
- 149. Test how plants grow in water with light or no light.
- 150. Track how ocean water moves by watching floating things.
