List of best Cultural Heritage Project Ideas For High School Students:

Family History and Genealogy Projects

1. Make a family tree showing four generations of your family stories.
2. Talk to your grandparents about games they played as kids and family traditions.
3. Make a photo book that shows how family clothes changed over the years.
4. Write down family recipes and the stories of who first made each dish.
5. Build a timeline to show when your family moved to different places.
6. Draw a map that shows where all your relatives live around the world.
7. Write letters to cousins far away and ask them about their family memories.
8. Make a scrapbook of old family pictures and add funny captions under each.
9. Make a video of three generations cooking the same recipe together at home.
10. Look up what your last name means and where it first started.
11. Collect family keepsakes and write the special story behind each item.
12. Draw your family's coat of arms with symbols that show what each person means.
13. Make a calendar that shows family birthdays and special achievements.
14. Make a puzzle out of a big photo of your whole family together.

33. Design postcards that show your town's most beautiful or unique places.
34. Make a timeline of your school's history with old photos and stories.
35. Talk to local firefighters about how their job has changed over time.
36. Make a cookbook with recipes from different local restaurant owners.
37. Create a photo essay of local street art and community murals.
38. Write articles for a newspaper about hidden historical gems in your town.
39. Make a video tour of your local cemetery's most interesting monuments.
